**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MAYOR, HON. STRIKE B. REVILLA, TO SIGN AN URGENT PETITION FOR THE ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATE OF EXCEPTION AND AUTHORIZATION FOR THE RELEASE OF PUBLIC FUNDS FOR THE VARIOUS PROJECTS, PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES OF THE CITY GOVERNMENT OF BACOR, CAVITE IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE COMMISSION ON ELECTIONS (COMELEC) RESOLUTION NO. 10917, SERIES OF 2023.**

**WHEREAS**, on 14 June 2023, the Office of the City Mayor sent a letter to the Sangguniang Panlungsod requesting to pass a resolution to authorize the City Mayor to sign an urgent petition for the issuance of a certificate of exception and authorization for the release of public funds for the various projects, programs and activities of the City Government of Bacoor, Cavite in compliance with the Commission on Elections (COMELEC) Resolution No. 10917, Series of 2023.

**WHEREAS**, the Commission on Elections (COMELEC) issued Resolution No. 10917 pertaining to the date of the plebiscite in the City of Bacoor to be held on 29 July 2023 and calendar of activities and periods of certain prohibited acts approved and promulgated on 17 May 2023.

**WHEREAS**, the City Government of Bacoor is petitioning the COMELEC to acknowledge its mandate of delivering basic services under the Republic Act 7160 (otherwise known as the "Local Government Code of 1991") during the Election Ban Period from June 28, 2023 to 27 July 2023 as the said electoral prohibition might delay the completion of various programs, project and activities of the city government.

**WHEREAS**, the urgent petition will be submitted to the COMELEC in relation to the time-specific "Prohibited Acts" and for the issuance of a Certificate of Exception from the prohibition pursuant to Section 261 (v) of the Omnibus Election Code of the

## URGENT PETITION

FOR THE ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATE OF EXCEPTION  
AND AUTHORIZATION TO RELEASE, DISBURSE  
AND EXPEND PUBLIC FUNDS

Petitioner, the CITY GOVERNMENT OF BACOR ("Bacoor LGU" or "BACOR"), acting through City Mayor STRIKE B. REVILLA, by the undersigned counsel and unto the Honorable Commission on Elections ("COMELEC" or "Commission"), most respectfully submits the foregoing URGENT PETITION pursuant to the prohibitions set by COMELEC Resolution No. 10917 approved and promulgated on 17 May 2023, and hereby state that:

### PREFATORY STATEMENT

***"No proscription should be so strict as to preclude, hamper or suspend the delivery of much-needed basic services and the perquisites of public service for the general welfare of the community."***

1. Basic services are public goods and the primary responsibility and accountability for their delivery remains with the State. The 1987 Constitution, particularly Section 4 and 5 of Article II, declares as the State's principles that:

"SECTION 4. The prime duty of the Government is to serve and protect the people. The Government may call upon the people to defend the State and, in the fulfillment

thereof, all citizens may be required, under conditions provided by law, to render personal military or civil service.

SECTION 5. The maintenance of peace and order, the protection of life, liberty, and property, and **the promotion of the general welfare are essential for the enjoyment by all the people of the blessings of democracy.** (Emphasis supplied)

2. The passage of Republic Act No. 7160 or the Local Government Code of 1991 has devolved to all local government units (LGUs) the administration of basic services, including agriculture, environmental protection, health, maintenance of public works and highways, social welfare, and tourism. The law was enacted to empower LGUs with the end in view of improving the delivery of services to the public, thereby becoming effective instruments of both local and national development.

3. The decision of the Supreme Court in the consolidated case of Mandanas, et. al v. Executive Secretary et. al., G.R. No. 199802, July 03, 2018 and Garcia, Jr. et. al. v. Executive Secretary, et. al. G.R. No. 208488, July 3, 2018<sup>1</sup> buttressed the Constitutional mandate of local autonomy – *decentralization*. In that case, the High Court discussed that **decentralization of administration occurs when the central government delegates administrative powers to the LGUs** as the means of broadening the base of governmental powers and of making the LGUs more responsive and accountable in the process, and thereby ensure their fullest development as self-reliant communities and more effective partners in the pursuit of the goals of national development and social progress.

4. Section 3 of the Local Government Code clearly specified the guidelines that will aid in the formulation and implementation of policies and measures on local autonomy, viz:

**(a) There shall be an effective allocation among the different local government units of their respective powers, functions, responsibilities, and resources;**

**(b) There shall be established in every local government unit an accountable, efficient, and dynamic organizational structure and operating mechanism that**

**will meet the priority needs and service requirements of its communities;**

(c) Subject to civil service law, rules and regulations, local officials and employees paid wholly or mainly from local funds shall be appointed or removed, according to merit and fitness, by the appropriate appointing authority;

**(d) The vesting of duty, responsibility, and accountability in local government units shall be accompanied with provision for reasonably adequate resources to discharge their powers and effectively carry out their functions;** hence, they shall have the power to create and broaden their own sources of revenue and the right to a just share in national taxes and an equitable share in the proceeds of the utilization and development of the national wealth within their respective areas;

(e) Provinces with respect to component cities and municipalities, and cities and municipalities with respect to component Barangays, shall ensure that the acts of their component units are within the scope of their prescribed powers and functions;

(f) Local government units may group themselves, consolidate or coordinate their efforts, services, and resources for purposes commonly beneficial to them;

(g) The capabilities of local government units, especially the municipalities and Barangays, shall be enhanced by providing them with opportunities to participate actively in the implementation of national programs and projects;

(h) There shall be a continuing mechanism to enhance local autonomy not only by legislative enabling acts but also by administrative and organizational reforms;

(i) Local government units shall share with the national government the responsibility in the management and maintenance of ecological balance within their territorial jurisdiction, subject to the provisions of this Code and national policies;

(j) Effective mechanisms for ensuring the accountability of local government units to their respective constituents shall be strengthened in order to upgrade continually the quality of local leadership;

(k) The realization of local autonomy shall be facilitated through improved coordination of national government policies and programs and extension of adequate technical and material assistance to less developed and deserving local government units;

(l) The participation of the private sector in local governance, particularly in the delivery of basic services, shall be encouraged to ensure the viability of local autonomy as an alternative strategy for sustainable development; and

(m) The national government shall ensure that decentralization tributes to the continuing improvement of the performance of local government units and the quality of community life.

5. To date, the roles, powers and functions delegated by the Local Government Code has already been expanded since its passage in the early 90s and is not merely limited to those enumeration under Section 17 paragraphs (a) and (b) of the Code. In fact, the organizational structure and operating mechanism of local government units constantly evolves to continuously address the priority needs and service requirements of its respective communities.

6. For instance, unlike the previous decade, the programs, projects and activities ("PPAs") in Bacoor are not focused anymore to just infrastructure projects and social welfare projects. Rather, it now covers an array of expenses from purchase of machineries, instruments, supplies and other materials to improvement of data and other information gathering capacity for a more efficient public service, *i.e. procurement of Agriculture and Aquaculture machineries; Updating of Climate Disaster Risk Assessment; expenses for the conduct of mass weddings sponsored by the City; installation and upgrading of CCTVs and Radio Transceiver; Assistance to informal settler families displaced by the Supreme Court's Continuing Mandamus for the protection and rehabilitation of Manila Bay; right of way acquisition and road widening projects; procurement of supplies for Bacoor Marching Arts workshop.*

7. With this Petition, the City Government of Bacoor, duly converted into a component city in the province of Cavite by virtue of Republic Act No. 10160<sup>2</sup>, humbly requests the Honorable Commission to **acknowledge the former's mandate of having the primary responsibility of delivering basic services under the Local Government Code during the period from 28 June 2023 to 27 July 2023 ("Election Ban Period")**, the same period **when electoral prohibitions might hinder or delay vital and imperative PPAs of the City Government of Bacoor's departments, units or offices for the welfare of the marginalized sector in Bacoor.**

8. Based from the foregoing, the City Government of Bacoor respectfully files this Urgent Petition. The City Government of Bacoor, through its local chief executive, City Mayor, STRIKE B. REVILLA, may be served with copies of the Honorable Commission's notices, orders, resolutions and other processes through its counsel with principal office located at Bacoor Government Center, Bacoor Boulevard, Brgy. Bayanan, Bacoor City, Cavite.

This Urgent Petition is submitted to the Honorable Commission in relation to time-specific "Prohibited Acts" or acts which shall constitute election offense/s under Section 261, Article XXII of Batas Pambansa Blg 881 ("Omnibus Election Code") and **for the issuance of a Certificate of Exception from the prohibition under Section 261(v) of the Omnibus Election Code for the following releases, disbursements and expenditures** to be made by the Bacoor LGU departments, units and offices on the period of 28 June 2023 to 27 July 2023, in particular:

- a. The following various **Programs, Projects and Activities** (Infrastructure) are being undertaken **by the City Engineering Office**, as part of its duties under Section 32 of RA 10160, which forms an integral part of the delivery of basic services in the City of Bacoor, more particularly described in **Annex "A"**<sup>3</sup>:

10. The abovementioned list cover both infrastructure and non-infrastructure PPAs of the various departments, offices and units in the City Government of Bacoor. These PPAs form an integral part of the City Government's provision of basic services not only to its constituents but also to attached government agencies like the BJMP, PNP, DepEd City School Division, BFP and City Prosecutors Office.
11. Indubitably, to abruptly halt the implementation of these PPAs for a period of thirty (30) days, during the Election Ban on public spending, will unnecessarily result in the suspension of these much-needed services, albeit temporarily. To the recipient of these basic services, such as those Informal Settler Families displaced by virtue of the Supreme Court's Continuing Mandamus, thirty (30) days of prohibition on public spending means a great deal because it will delay the financial assistance to their family which could translate to hunger considering the sudden loss of income.
12. Moreover, for the repair of drainage in various locations in the City, the deferment of these projects for thirty (30) days, especially those that have already commenced would only do more harm than good. Traffic will worsen, the rainfall caused by consecutive typhoons will bring about more flood, among others. All these as a result of the sudden stoppage of the drainage repair.
13. These are merely a few possible outcomes should the Election Ban on public spending be implemented to these PPAs of the departments, offices and units in the City Government.
14. Understandably, the conduct of the plebiscite for merging of various Barangay commenced due to the application of Bacoor LGU. The strengthening of the Barangay is part and parcel of the outcome that the City wants to achieve – an improved local autonomy for an effective, efficient and unhampered delivery of basic services. However, the Bacoor LGU's desire to strengthen its Barangay through merging should not be at the expense of the delivery of much-needed basic services and facilities to the constituents of the City.

**PRAYER**

**WHEREFORE**, premises considered, the Bacoor LGU most respectfully prays for the Honorable COMELEC to **IMMEDIATELY AND FAVORABLY CONSIDER** this URGENT PETITION and, accordingly **ISSUE THE CERTIFICATE OF EXCEPTION** for all releases, disbursements and expenditures by the departments, offices, units in the City Government for its above listed mandated, statutory, and specialized Programs, Projects and Activities, including the routine and normal expenses, from the prohibition under Section 261(v)(2) of the Omnibus Election Code.

Other reliefs, just and equitable under the circumstances, are likewise prayed for.
